-- Jack Drury posted an assist tonight and has now earned five points in his last six games (12/27-1/6: 2g, 3a).

-- Sebastian Aho scored Carolina's only goal in the shootout tonight and leads the team with two shootout goals this season. His six career shootout goals are now tied for the fourth-most in team history.

STREAKING AHEAD

Despite falling in a shootout tonight, Carolina extended its point streak to six games (12/27-1/6: 5-0-1), tied for the team's longest point streak this season (also 12/12-12/21: 3-0-3). Tonight's defeat snapped the Hurricanes' season-long, five-game win streak (12/27-1/5), but they have now registered a point in 12 of their last 13 games (12/12-1/6: 8-1-4) and are one of just three NHL teams with fewer than two regulation losses over that span.

POWER SURGE

The Hurricanes converted on their only power play tonight, scoring on the man-advantage for the seventh consecutive game (12/23-1/6). During that stretch, Carolina is 13-for-25 (52.0%) on the power play, and they have tied for the fourth-longest streak of games with at least one power play goal in team history (since relocation). The Hurricanes last scored a power play goal in seven straight games from 2/27/21-3/11/21, going 12-for-25 on the man-advantage (48%).

WORKING FROM HOME

After playing a league-high 23 of its first 39 games on the road (12-10-1), Carolina opened a season-long, six-game homestand tonight (1/6-1/21), with 11 of its next 12 games at PNC Arena (1/6-2/10). The Hurricanes have played the fewest home games of any NHL team this season (now 10-3-4 in 17 GP), and they have now earned a point in eight of their last nine games at PNC Arena (11/26-1/6: 4-1-4), including a season-long, six-game home point streak from 11/26-12/19 (3-0-3). **Teuvo Teravainen** opened the scoring tonight with his 14th goal of the season, tied with **Seth Jarvis** for the second-most of any Hurricanes skater, and he leads the team with eight goals at PNC Arena in 2023-24.

SATURDAY NIGHT IN RALEIGHWOOD

Tonight's attendance was a sellout figure of 18,903. Including regular season and playoffs, this marked the Hurricanes' 38th consecutive sellout at PNC Arena (2/24/23-present). Carolina's last non-sellout at home came on 2/21/23, when a crowd of 18,142 watched the team post a 4-1 win vs. STL.

GOING BACK-TO-BACK

Tonight, the Hurricanes closed their seventh of 14 sets of back-to-back games in 2023-24. Following tonight's shootout loss, they are now 5-2-0 in the first game and 3-2-2 in the second game of back-to-backs this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 1-for-1 on the power play tonight and is 39-for-136 (28.7%) on the man advantage in 2023-24. The Hurricanes went 1-for-1 on the penalty kill and are 106-for-128 (82.8%) on the kill this season.
- St. Louis went 0-for-1 on the power play tonight and is 12-for-109 (11.0%) on the man advantage in 2023-24. The Blues went 0-for-1 on the penalty kill and are 78-for-99 (78.8%) on the kill this season.
