-- Brent Burns tallied a power-play assist tonight, and he has now earned 13 points in his last 14 games (12/27-1/27: 3g, 10a), with seven power-play points (2g, 5a) over that span.

-- Jack Drury recorded an assist tonight, giving him three assists in his last four games (1/21-1/27) and eight points in his last 11 contests (1/2-1/27: 3g, 5a).

-- Seth Jarvis posted two assists tonight for his ninth multi-point game and fourth multi-assist game of the season.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER

Dmitry Orlov scored the game-winning goal with just 36 seconds left in regulation tonight (59:24), marking the latest regulation, go-ahead goal of his NHL career (previous: 11/28/21 at CAR, 57:05) and Carolina's latest such goal this season (previous: **Sebastian Aho**, 11/26/23 vs. CBJ, 58:05). The Hurricanes' last go-ahead goal in the final minute of regulation came on 4/1/21, when **Jesper Fast** scored at 59:31 to clinch a 4-3 win at CHI. Orlov has now registered 17 points (3g, 14a) in 48 games in 2023-24, and Carolina's defensemen have combined for 31 goals this season, tied with CGY for the third-most goals of any NHL blue line.

SETH AND CANDY

Seth Jarvis earned two assists tonight, and he has now registered an assist in each of his last four games (1/21-1/27: 5a), marking the longest assist streak of his NHL/Hurricanes career. He has tallied 23 assists through 48 games this season, matching his 68-game total from 2021-22 and just two shy of his career-high, 82-game total from 2022-23 (25). Jarvis has joined Mark Howe (1979-82), Ron Francis (1981-84), Sylvain Turgeon (1983-86), Eric Staal (2003-07), Victor Rask (2014-17) and **Sebastian Aho** (2016-19) as the seventh player in franchise history to post at least 20 assists in each of his first three NHL seasons.

FORCE OF NECAS

Martin Necas scored Carolina's opening goal on the power play tonight, giving him four goals and five points in five games since returning from injury (1/19-1/27: 4g, 1a). He has scored a goal in four of those contests, as he posted a three-game goal/point streak from 1/19-1/24 (3g, 1a). Necas has scored two power-play goals over that span (also 1/24 at BOS) and now ranks sixth on the team in that category (3) in 2023-24. Before his injury, he had scored four goals over his previous 25 games (11/10-1/2: 4g, 11a).

ASK ABOUT OUR SPECIALS

Martin Necas scored Carolina's first 4-on-3 goal of the season tonight, giving the Hurricanes a power-play goal in 13 of their last 15 games (12/23-1/27: 19-for-50, 38.0%). They also went 1-for-1 on the penalty kill, holding the opposing power play scoreless for the ninth time in their last 12 games (12/30-1/27: 31-for-34, 91.2%). Since December, Carolina leads the NHL in both power-play percentage (29-for-82: 35.4%) and penalty kill percentage (73-for-79: 92.4%), outscoring opponents by 23 goals on special teams over that span (31-8).

TIME FOR A BREAK

Antti Raanta stopped 10 of 11 shots faced in net tonight to record his second straight win (1/25-1/27) and earn a point for the eighth time in his last 10 games (12/15-1/27: 6-2-2). Raanta has improved to 12-7-2 in 23 appearances this season, and in 40 games at PNC Arena during his Hurricanes career, he has now posted a 31-5-4 record (.825), 2.29 goals-against average, .906 save percentage and six shutouts. Entering a bye week (1/28-1/31) and the NHL All-Star break (2/1-2/3), Carolina has registered a point in 13 of its last 16 games at PNC Arena (11/26-1/27: 9-3-4) and posted an 11-2-1 record over its last 14 games (12/27-1/27).

CALLING THE SHOTS

The Hurricanes did not allow a shot on goal in the third period tonight, accomplishing the feat for the seventh time in franchise history and fifth time since relocation (last: 3/5/23 vs. TBL, 2nd). Carolina held Arizona to just 11 shots in the game, marking the team's fewest allowed in any contest this season (previous: 1/19 vs. DET, 12). The Hurricanes allowed 11 or fewer shots for the first time since 1/30/21 vs. DAL (11) and tied for their third-fewest shots allowed in any game since relocation (3/26/00 vs. NYI: 10, 3/22/07 vs. WSH: 10). Their +28 shot differential (39-11) also marked their highest in any game in 2023-24, and they lead the NHL in both shots allowed per game (25.0) and shot differential per game (+8.3) this season.

SATURDAY NIGHT IN RALEIGHWOOD

Tonight's attendance was a sellout figure of 18,718. Including regular season and playoffs, this marks the Hurricanes' 44th consecutive sellout at PNC Arena (2/24/23-present). Carolina's last non-sellout at home came on 2/21/23, when a crowd of 18,142 watched the team post a 4-1 win vs. STL.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 1-for-2 on the power play tonight and is 45-for-161 (28.0%) on the man advantage in 2023-24. The Hurricanes went 1-for-1 on the penalty kill and are 128-for-152 (84.2%) on the kill this season.
- Arizona went 0-for-1 on the power play tonight and is 33-for-148 (22.3%) on the man advantage in 2023-24. The Coyotes went 1-for-2 on the penalty kill and are 123-for-156 (78.8%) on the kill this season.
