- Sebastian Aho tallied an assist tonight, extending his assist/point streak to four games (3/16-3/21: 2g, 6a).
- Jalen Chatfield scored a goal tonight, giving him three points in his last three games (3/17-3/21: 2g, 1a).
- Martin Necas posted an assist tonight, extending his point streak to three games (3/17-3/21: 1g, 2a).
- Dmitry Orlov earned an assist tonight, giving him seven points in his last five games (3/14-3/21: 2g, 5a).
- Seth Jarvis scored the overtime winner tonight, giving him eight points in his last seven games (3/10-3/21: 7g, 1a).

SUDDEN SETH

Seth Jarvis scored the second overtime goal of his NHL/Hurricanes career tonight (also 4/23/22 at NJD), becoming the fourth different Hurricanes skater to score an overtime winner this season (also **Sebastian Aho**: 2, **Martin Necas**: 2, **Brett Pesce**: 1). He has now extended his career-long goal streak to five games (3/14-3/21: 6g), marking Carolina's longest goal streak since Aho's six-game run last season (1/21/23-2/1/23: 9g). At 22 years and 49 days old, Jarvis has become the sixth different player in franchise history to score in five or more consecutive games before turning 23, joining Aho (6 GP from 1/31/20-2/11/20: 7g, 3a; 5 GP from 11/13/17-11/22/17: 5g, 5a) as just the second different player to accomplish the feat since relocation. Tonight's goal also marked Jarvis' fourth game-winning goal in his last five games (3/14-3/21), and his eight winners this season are now a team high. The Hurricanes have improved to 6-2 in games decided in overtime in 2023-24, with the third-highest win percentage (.750) of any NHL team in those contests (NYR: 7-1, .875; CGY: 5-1, .833).

FEEL THE BURN

Brent Burns skated in his 831st consecutive game tonight (11/21/13-3/21/24), passing Andrew Cogliano (EDM/ANA, 830 GP from 10/4/07-1/13/18) for the seventh-longest ironman streak in NHL history. He trails only Phil Kessel's league-record, 1,064-game ironman streak (TOR/PIT/ARI/VGK, 11/3/09-4/13/23) for the NHL's longest active ironman streak, and his streak is also the second-longest by any defenseman in league history (Keith Yandle, ARI/NYR/FLA/PHI, 3/26/09-3/29/22: 989 GP).

MARTY PARTY

Jordan Martinook opened the scoring with his 13th goal of the season tonight. He has now scored 12 of those goals in 33 games since the calendar flipped to 2024, after scoring one goal in his first 37 games this season (10/11-12/30). Martinook's 12 goals are already tied for his second-most in any calendar year during his NHL career (also 2018: 79 GP), trailing only his 14-goal output in 2022 (73 GP).

JOINING THE ATTACK

Jalen Chatfield (1g), **Brent Burns** (1a), **Dmitry Orlov** (1a) and **Brett Pesce** (1a) all found the scoresheet tonight, and Carolina's defensemen have now combined for 39 points in the team's last 11 games (2/29-3/21: 9g, 30a), including 16 points over the last three contests (3/17-3/21: 4g, 12a). Chatfield's goal also marked the Hurricanes' 43rd goal from the blue line in 2023-24, tied with MTL for the second-most in the NHL (COL: 54).

FULL HOUSE

Tonight's attendance is a sellout figure of 18,700. Including regular season and playoffs, this marks the Hurricanes' 56th consecutive sellout at PNC Arena (2/24/23-present). Carolina's last non-sellout at home came on 2/21/23, when a crowd of 18,142 watched the team post a 4-1 win vs. STL.

GOING BACK-TO-BACK

The Hurricanes opened their 13th of 14 sets of back-to-back games in 2023-24. With tonight's win, they are 10-3-0 in the first game and 7-2-3 in the second game of back-to-backs this season. Carolina's .769 points percentage in the first game of back-to-backs ranks fourth in the NHL.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 0-for-2 on the power play tonight and is 56-for-214 (26.2%) on the man advantage in 2023-24. The Hurricanes went 3-for-3 on the penalty kill and are 191-for-222 (86.0%) on the kill this season.
- Philadelphia went 0-for-3 on the power play tonight and is 28-for-220 (12.7%) on the man advantage in 2023-24. The Flyers went 2-for-2 on the penalty kill and are 187-for-221 (84.6%) on the kill this season.
