#### JACKPOT

**Jack Drury** scored the first playoff goal of his NHL/Hurricanes career tonight, giving him six points (1g, 5a) in 18 career postseason contests. His goal stood as the game- and series-winning tally, as he became the fourth player in franchise history to have his first playoff goal stand as a series-clinching goal (also Ulf Samuelsson, 1986 ADSF G3 vs. QUE; Scott Walker, 2009 ECSF G7 at BOS; Greg McKegg, 2019 ECSR G4 vs. NYI).

## ISLAND HOPPING

The Hurricanes defeated the Islanders in the Eastern Conference First Round for the second straight postseason, and they have now earned a 12-3 record in the teams' three playoff meetings dating back to the 2019 Eastern Conference Second Round. New York has now joined New Jersey as the second team to fall to Hartford/Carolina in three different postseasons. **Rod Brind'Amour** has led the Hurricanes to a postseason series win in each of his first six seasons behind the bench, joining Pat Burns (MTL, TOR: 1988-94) as the second coach in league history to accomplish the feat. His six playoff series wins with Carolina have also passed Paul Maurice (1999, 2001-02, 2009: 5-4) for the most by any head coach in franchise history. With an assist tonight, **Jacob Slavin** has now earned 10 points (1g, 9a) in 13 potential series-clinching games, tying Eric Staal (2006, 2009: 4g, 10a in 12 GP) for the second-most such points of any player in franchise history (**Sebastian Aho**: 8-4—12 in 13 GP).

## TURBO CHARGED

**Teuvo Teravainen** opened the scoring tonight, extending his playoff point streak to four games (4/22-4/30: 2g, 2a). He has now posted the longest playoff point streak of his NHL career, topping his three previous three-game streaks (all with Carolina). Teravainen's most recent such run came in 2022, lasting from Game 7 of the Eastern Conference First Round vs. BOS through the opening two games of the Eastern Conference Second Round vs. NYR (5/14/22-5/20/22: 1g, 3a).

## GAME FIVE

With tonight's win, the Whalers/Hurricanes improved to 12-15 all-time in the fifth game of a best-of-seven series, with a 10-6 record on home ice in those contests. They also improved to 3-4 in Game 5 after taking a 3-1 series lead (3-3 at home). ## LIGHTNING STRIKES TWICE

**Jack Drury** (44:36) and **Stefan Noesen** (44:44) scored two goals in just eight seconds to give Carolina the lead in the third period, marking the two fastest goals in franchise playoff history. The previous record was set just eight days ago, when **Sebastian Aho** (57:45) and **Jordan Martinook** (57:54) netted two goals nine seconds apart in Game 3, also giving the Hurricanes a third-period lead. According to NHL Records, the Hurricanes became the second team in league history to score two goals within a span of less than 0:10 twice within a single postseason. The Oilers previously accomplished the feat in 1983, scoring in spans of 0:07 (SDSF G1 vs. WPG) and 0:08 (SDF G1 vs. CGY), and their goals also came eight days apart (4/6/83-4/14/83).

## FAST AND FURIOUS

**Teuvo Teravainen** (1:23) and **Andrei Svechnikov** (3:13) scored two goals on Carolina's first five shots tonight, marking the fastest two goals to open any game in franchise playoff history. The previous record was also set in a series-clinching win, as Erik Cole scored twice in 3:33 to open Game 6 of the 2002 Eastern Conference Semifinals vs. MTL.

## SLOW AND STEADY

**Evgeny Kuznetsov** converted on a penalty shot at 13:22 of the first period, marking just the second penalty shot attempt in franchise playoff history (both goals). **Jordan Martinook** also scored a penalty shot in Game 3 of the 2023 Eastern Conference Second Round at NJD (5/7/23).

## SETH APPEAL

**Seth Jarvis** tallied three points (1g, 2a) tonight for the seventh multi-point game of his NHL/Hurricanes playoff career and his second three-point game in the postseason. He also recorded three points (1g, 2a) in Game 2 vs. NYI, and at 22 years and 89 days old, he has joined Eric Staal (2006 ECQF G2 vs. MTL, 2006 ECSF G1 vs. NJD, 2006 SCF G5 vs. EDM) as the second player in franchise history to post two three-point games in the playoffs before turning 23. Jarvis leads all Hurricanes skaters with seven points (3g, 4a) through five games this postseason, and his three goals are tied with **Stefan Noesen** for the team lead.

## JACKPOT

**Jack Drury** scored the first playoff goal of his NHL/Hurricanes career tonight, giving him six points (1g, 5a) in 18 career postseason contests. His goal stood as the game- and series-winning tally, as he became the fourth player in franchise history to have his first playoff goal stand as a series-clinching goal (also Ulf Samuelsson, 1986 ADSF G3 vs. QUE; Scott Walker, 2009 ECSF G7 at BOS; Greg McKegg, 2019 ECSR G4 vs. NYI).

## ISLAND HOPPING

The Hurricanes defeated the Islanders in the Eastern Conference First Round for the second straight postseason, and they have now earned a 12-3 record in the teams' three playoff meetings dating back to the 2019 Eastern Conference Second Round. New York has now joined New Jersey as the second team to fall to Hartford/Carolina in three different postseasons. **Rod Brind'Amour** has led the Hurricanes to a postseason series win in each of his first six seasons behind the bench, joining Pat Burns (MTL, TOR: 1988-94) as the second coach in league history to accomplish the feat. His six playoff series wins with Carolina have also passed Paul Maurice (1999, 2001-02, 2009: 5-4) for the most by any head coach in franchise history. With an assist tonight, **Jacob Slavin** has now earned 10 points (1g, 9a) in 13 potential series-clinching games, tying Eric Staal (2006, 2009: 4g, 10a in 12 GP) for the second-most such points of any player in franchise history (**Sebastian Aho**: 8-4—12 in 13 GP).

## TURBO CHARGED

**Teuvo Teravainen** opened the scoring tonight, extending his playoff point streak to four games (4/22-4/30: 2g, 2a). He has now posted the longest playoff point streak of his NHL career, topping his three previous three-game streaks (all with Carolina). Teravainen's most recent such run came in 2022, lasting from Game 7 of the Eastern Conference First Round vs. BOS through the opening two games of the Eastern Conference Second Round vs. NYR (5/14/22-5/20/22: 1g, 3a).

## GAME FIVE

With tonight's win, the Whalers/Hurricanes improved to 12-15 all-time in the fifth game of a best-of-seven series, with a 10-6 record on home ice in those contests. They also improved to 3-4 in Game 5 after taking a 3-1 series lead (3-3 at home). Hartford/Carolina has now posted a 17-15 record with a chance to clinch a best-of-seven series, with an 8-4 home record (7-4 at PNC Arena).

## FULL HOUSE

Tonight's attendance was a sellout figure of 18,874, marking Carolina's 64th consecutive sellout at PNC Arena (2/24/23-present), including both regular season and playoffs. The Hurricanes' last non-sellout at home came on 2/21/23, when a crowd of 18,142 watched the team post a 4-1 win vs. STL. This season, the Hurricanes sold out every single home game for the first time in franchise history.

## SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 1-for-1 on the power play tonight and are 5-for-15 (33.3%) on the man-advantage during the playoffs. The Hurricanes went 3-for-4 on the penalty kill and are 8-for-11 (72.7%) on the kill this postseason.
- New York went 1-for-4 on the power play tonight and are 3-for-11 (27.3%) on the man-advantage during the playoffs. The Islanders went 0-for-1 on the penalty kill and are 10-for-15 (66.7%) on the kill this postseason.
