CAROLINA HURRICANES 2023 DEVELOPMENT CAMP GUIDE

RALEIGH, N.C. – The Carolina Hurricanes will host their 2023 Prospects Development Camp from July 10 to July 13. Players will go through off-ice training and educational sessions during the week, as well as on-ice sessions at Invisalign Arena. Attendees include Hurricanes prospects who are under contract and recent Hurricanes draft picks who have not yet signed. In addition, some undrafted and free agent amateur players will be in attendance.

All on-ice sessions are open to the public and media. Players will be available to the media at the conclusion of the final on-ice session each day. The full on-ice schedule can be found below.

Melting Pot – Attendees of this year's development camp spent most of the 2022-23 season playing at the following levels:

College – 8 players (3 Hockey East, 2 ECAC, 2 NCHC, 1 Big Ten)

Major Junior – 3 players (2 QMJHL, 1 OHL)

Other North American Junior – 5 players (3 USHL, 2 BCHL)

European Pro – 4 players (2 SHL, 1 Liiga, 1 Germany-2)

Back to School – Seven different NCAA programs are represented by current, former or committed players at this year's development camp, with four of those colleges boasting multiple attendees:

Boston University – 1 player (Domenick Fensore)

Denver – 1 player (Massimo Rizzo)

Wisconsin – 1 player (Cruz Lucius)

Family Business – In addition to the Nadeau brothers, six other players attending this year's development camp have close relatives with NHL connections:

Jackson Blake's father, Jason, recorded 486 points (213g, 273a) in 871 career NHL games with LAK, NYI, TOR and ANA from 1999-12.

Charles-Alexis Legault's father, Alexandre, was selected by EDM in the second round (38th overall) of the 1990 NHL Draft.

Cruz Lucius' older brother, Chaz, was selected 18th overall by WPG in the 2021 NHL Draft.

Scott Morrow's uncle, also named Scott, was selected by HFD in the fifth round (95th overall) of the 1988 NHL Draft and skated in four NHL games with CGY in 1994-95.

Maxim Namestnikov has four close relatives who played in the NHL:

His brother, Vladislav, was selected 27th overall by TBL in the 2011 NHL Draft and has registered 261 points (115g, 146a) in 630 career NHL games with TBL, NYR, OTT, COL, DET, DAL and WPG.

His father, Evgeny, was selected by VAN in the sixth round (117th overall) of the 1991 NHL Draft and recorded nine assists in 43 career NHL games with VAN, NYI and NSH from 1993-00.

His uncle, Vyacheslav Kozlov, was selected by DET in the third round (45th overall) of the 1990 NHL Draft and tallied 853 points (356g, 497a) in 1,182 career NHL games with DET, BUF and ATL from 1992-10, winning two Stanley Cups with the Red Wings in 1997 and 1998.

His uncle, Ivan Novoseltsev, was selected by FLA in the fourth round (95th overall) of the 1997 NHL Draft and posted 75 points (31g, 44a) in 234 career NHL games with FLA and PHX from 1999-04.

Justin Robidas' father, Stephane, was selected by MTL in the seventh round (164th overall) of the 1995 NHL Draft and earned 258 points (57g, 201a) in 937 career NHL games with MTL, DAL, CHI, ANA and TOR from 1999-15. He is currently an assistant coach for the Canadiens.

Winners' Circle – Four players attending this year's development camp won league championships in 2022-23:

Charles-Alexis Legault and Yaniv Perets helped Quinnipiac capture its first national championship. Perets posted a 4-0 record, 1.26 goals-against average, .948 save percentage and one shutout during the NCAA tournament, earning selection to the All-Tournament team.

Bradly Nadeau and Josh Nadeau won the Fred Page Cup (BCHL title) for the second consecutive season, as Bradly was named the league's playoff MVP. His 17 goals led all BCHL skaters during the postseason, while his 35 points ranked tied for the league lead alongside Josh (16g, 19a), who tallied a league-best 19 assists.

Justin Robidas won the Gilles-Courteau Trophy (QMJHL title) and Memorial Cup (CHL title) with Quebec, posting 27 points (11g, 16a) in 18 QMJHL playoff games and adding a team-high five assists in four Memorial Cup games.

Flying Colors – Four players attending this year's development camp represented their countries at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship in Halifax and Moncton:

Jackson Blake won a bronze medal with the United States, recording six points (1g, 5a) in seven games.

Alexi Heimosalmi and Ville Koivunen each served as alternate captains for Finland and earned two assists in five games.

Nikita Quapp was named one of Germany's top three players, with a 1-3 record and .901 save percentage in four games.

Age Gap – Goaltender **Yaniv Perets** (born March 4, 2000) and forward **Felix Unger Sorum** (born Sept. 14, 2005) are the oldest and youngest development camp attendees, respectively, giving the roster an age range of 2,020 days.

Jackson Blake

Right Wing (53)

Drafted by CAR in the fourth round, 109th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Blake tallied 42 points (16g, 26a) in 39 collegiate games as a freshman at North Dakota, finishing seventh in scoring among all Division I freshmen. He ranked second in goals, assists and points among all NCHC freshmen and was named the league's Rookie of the Year, also earning All-NCHC Second Team honors. Blake posted the third-most multi-point games of any Division I skater (13) and found the scoresheet in 11 consecutive games from 11/11-1/6 (5g, 8a), and he was named the NCHC Rookie of the Month for January and February. He won a bronze medal with the United States at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship, recording six points (1g, 5a) in seven games.



Michael Emerson

Right Wing (78)

Drafted by CAR in the sixth round, 190th overall, of the 2023 NHL Draft

Emerson recorded 64 points (30g, 34a) in 60 USHL games with Chicago in 2022-23, ranking tied for third on the team in goals, sixth in points, second in power-play goals (13) and fourth in game-winning goals (5). His two shorthanded goals also tied for the team lead, and he was one of just two Steel skaters with multiple goals at all three strengths. Emerson also finished second on the team in goals (3) and tied for first in power-play goals (2) in six playoff contests. He is committed to play college hockey at North Dakota in 2023-24, alongside fellow Hurricanes prospects Jackson Blake and Jayden Perron.



Domenick Fensore

Defenseman (89)

Drafted by CAR in the third round, 90th overall, of the 2019 NHL Draft

Domenick Fensore posted 31 points (9g, 22a) in 37 collegiate games during his senior season at Boston University, captaining the Terriers to Hockey East regular-season and tournament titles en route to the 23rd Frozen Four appearance in program history. He ranked tied for second in goals, assists and points among all Hockey East defensemen while also ranking tied for first among that group in power-play goals (4). Fensore was named a Hockey East First-Team All-Star and three-time Hockey East Defender of the Week (12/5, 1/2, 2/27), and he signed an entry-level contract with Carolina on 4/14.



Simon Forsmark

Defenseman (65)

Drafted by CAR in the fourth round, 101st overall, of the 2022 NHL Draft

Forsmark spent most of the 2022-23 season in Sweden's top junior league, registering 32 points (6g, 24a) in 41 J20 Nationell games with Orebro HK's under-20 team (6-24—30 in 33 GP) and Timra IK's under-20 team (0-2—2 in 8 GP). He ranked ninth in points and sixth in assists among all junior league defensemen. Forsmark also skated in 11 SHL games with Orebro HK (9 GP) and Timra IK (2 GP), and he played five games with AIK in HockeyAllsvenskan, Sweden's second-highest professional league. He has tallied three assists in 57 SHL games with Orebro HK and Timra IK since debuting with Orebro in 2020-21.



Patrik Hamrla

Goaltender (39)

Drafted by CAR in the third round, 83rd overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Hamrla played his second QMJHL season with Rimouski in 2022-23, earning a 19-19-3 record, 2.82 goals-against average and six shutouts in 44 appearances. He led all QMJHL netminders in shutouts and finished eighth in goals-against average (min. 20 GP), setting new career highs in both categories. Hamrla posted three shutouts in five games from 12/28-1/6, with a .948 save percentage over that span. He also made six playoff appearances, earning a 4-2 record, 3.46 goals-against average and .855 save percentage. Hamrla has signed to play for Ilves (Liiga) in 2023-24.



Aleksi Heimosalmi

Defenseman (47)

Drafted by CAR in the second round, 44th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Heimosalmi posted 15 points (4g, 11a) in 45 Liiga games with Assat in 2022-23. He ranked third among Assat defensemen in goals and assists, setting new career highs in both categories. Heimosalmi added three points (1g, 2a) in his first eight Liiga playoff games, scoring the game-winning goal in Game 2 against Ilves. He also represented Finland at the IIHF World Junior Championship for the second straight year, serving as an alternate captain and recording two assists in five games. Heimosalmi has earned 18 points (4g, 14a) in 92 career Liiga games with Assat.



Ville Koivunen

Left Wing (59)

Drafted by CAR in the second round, 51st overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Koivunen spent most of the 2022-23 season with Karpat, tallying 28 points (12g, 16a) in 52 Liiga games and adding one assist in three playoff contests. He ranked fifth on the team in points, tied for fifth in goals and tied for fourth in plus/minus (+9), setting new career highs in the latter two categories. Koivunen was reassigned to Chicago on 3/24 and finished the campaign with one goal in 12 AHL games, scoring his first AHL goal in the season finale against Manitoba (4/16). He also represented Finland at the IIHF World Junior Championship for the second straight year, serving as an alternate captain and recording two assists in five games.



Charles-Alexis Legault

Defenseman (62)

Drafted by CAR in the fifth round, 139th overall, of the 2023 NHL Draft

Legault posted nine points (2g, 7a) in 40 collegiate games as a freshman at Quinnipiac last season, helping the Bobcats win the first national championship in program history. He tallied 18 points (6g, 12a) in 36 BCHL games with Penticton in 2021-22 and ranked tied for second on the team in assists (9) in 11 playoff contests. Legault also played parts of two seasons in the USHL from 2019-21, earning five points (3g, 2a) in 25 games with Muskegon and Lincoln.

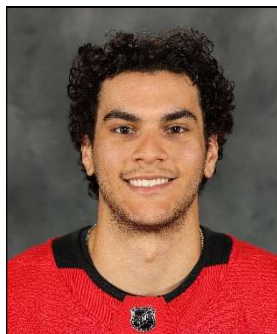


Cruz Lucius

Right Wing (57)

Drafted by CAR in the fourth round, 124th overall, of the 2022 NHL Draft

Lucius earned 34 points (11g, 23a) in 34 games as a freshman at Wisconsin in 2022-23, pacing the Badgers in assists and points and ranking tied for second in goals, tied for first in game-winning goals (2) and tied for third in power-play goals (4). He also finished tied for sixth in assists and eighth in points among all Big Ten freshmen and won Wisconsin's Mark Johnson Rookie of the Year Award. Lucius posted eight multi-point games, including two four-point outings, and he was named the Big Ten Second Star of the Week on 1/10 after tying the Wisconsin record for assists in a period (4) against #20 Notre Dame (1/7).



Lucas Mercuri

Center (79)

Drafted by CAR in the sixth round, 159th overall, of the 2020 NHL Draft

Mercuri registered 14 points (3g, 11a) during his sophomore season at UMass in 2022-23 and was one of just four Minutemen skaters to appear in all 35 games. He also won over half of his faceoffs (50.4%) for the second consecutive campaign (also 51.2% in 2021-22). Mercuri recorded a shorthanded assist in a 4-2 win over #1 Denver on 10/14, before posting the first three-point game of his collegiate career (1g, 2a) against Union on 10/22.



Bryce Montgomery

Defenseman (72)

Drafted by CAR in the sixth round, 170th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

After opening the 2022-23 season with one goal in two OHL games with London, Montgomery was traded to Cedar Rapids (USHL), where he posted 17 points (6g, 11a) in 48 games. He ranked second in plus/minus (+6) among all Roughriders defensemen and registered the first multi-goal game of his junior career against Muskegon on 1/28. Montgomery finished sixth on the team in penalty minutes (70) and tallied the game-winning goal, a fighting major and 30 penalty minutes against Des Moines (10/29) just three games into his USHL career.



Scott Morrow

Defenseman (56)

Drafted by CAR in the second round, 40th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Morrow recorded 31 points (9g, 22a) in 35 collegiate games during his sophomore season at UMass, becoming the second defenseman in program history to eclipse the 30-point mark in multiple seasons (also 13-20—33 in 37 GP In 2021-22). He ranked tied for second in goals, assists and points among all Hockey East blueliners and was named a conference Second-Team All-Star. Morrow was chosen as Hockey East's Defender of the Week twice (10/17, 3/7) and led all Minutemen skaters with 15 assists and 19 points in 24 conference games. He was also the only Hockey East defenseman to score at all three strengths, with four power-play goals and the first shorthanded tally of his collegiate career.



Bradly Nadeau

Left Wing (29)

Drafted by CAR in the first round, 30th overall, of the 2023 NHL Draft

Nadeau registered 113 points (45g, 68a) in 54 BCHL games with Penticton in 2022-23, leading all BCHL skaters in assists and points while finishing tied for the league lead in goals. He added 35 points (17g, 18a) in 17 playoff games and was named the BCHL's MVP for both the regular season and postseason as the Veeps won their second straight league title. After opening the campaign with a season-long, 17-game point streak from 9/23-11/22 (17g, 19a), Nadeau found the scoresheet in 64 of 71 total games, with 48 multi-point outings. He is committed to play college hockey at Maine next season alongside his brother Josh, who is attending development camp as an invitee.



Josh Nadeau

Right Wing (83)

Camp Invitee

Nadeau tallied 110 points (44g, 66a) in 54 BCHL games with Penticton in 2022-23, ranking second in assists and points and third in goals among all BCHL skaters. His 18 power-play goals also tied for the league lead, while his two shorthanded assists finished tied for third. Nadeau added 35 points (16g, 19a) in 17 playoff games, leading the league in assists and ranking tied for first in points and second in goals, to help the Veeps win their second straight league championship. He is committed to play college hockey at Maine next season alongside his brother Bradly, who was selected 30th overall by the Hurricanes in the 2023 NHL Draft.



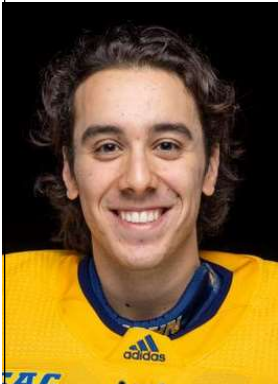
Maxim Namestnikov
Center (73)
Camp Invitee

Namestnikov tallied 61 points (39g, 22a) in 65 OHL games in 2022-23, split between Sarnia (4-3—7 in 18 GP) and Guelph (35-19—54 in 47 GP). He led all Storm skaters in goals and ranked fourth on the team in points, before scoring a team-high four goals in six playoff contests. Namestnikov has registered 101 points (55g, 46a) in 133 career OHL games with the Sting and Storm. His brother, Vladislav, has played 630 career NHL games with TBL, NYR, OTT, COL, DET, DAL and WPG.



Joel Nystrom
Defenseman (64)
Drafted by CAR in the seventh round, 219th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Nystrom played his second full SHL season in 2022-23, registering 16 points (6g, 10a) in 46 games with Farjestad BK and setting a new career high in goals. He added two goals in seven playoff games, tied for the team lead during the postseason. Nystrom has now skated in 119 SHL games with Farjestad BK over the last three seasons, earning 33 points (11g, 22a) and just 14 penalty minutes.



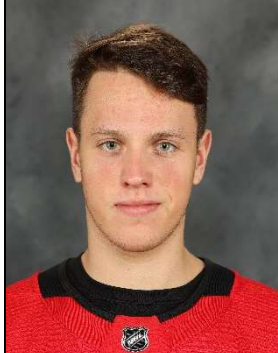
Yaniv Perets
Goaltender (60)
Signed by CAR as an undrafted free agent on April 11, 2023

Perets earned a 34-4-3 record, 1.49 goals-against average, .931 save percentage and 10 shutouts in 41 collegiate games in his third season at Quinnipiac, leading the Bobcats to the first national championship in program history. He led Division I in wins and goals-against average while ranking tied for first in shutouts and second in save percentage. Perets posted a 4-0 record, 1.26 goals-against average, .948 save percentage and one shutout during the NCAA tournament, earning selection to the All-Tournament team. He was selected as a top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Award in each of the past two seasons, also earning ECAC Player of the Year and Goaltender of the Year honors in 2021-22. Perets signed with Carolina as an undrafted free agent on 4/11.



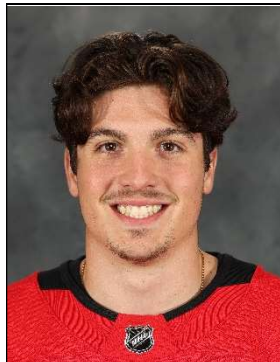
Jayden Perron
Right Wing (51)
Drafted by CAR in the third round, 94th overall, of the 2023 NHL Draft

Perron registered 72 points (24g, 48a) in 61 USHL games with Chicago in 2022-23, ranking tied for fifth in scoring among all USHL skaters and leading the Steel in assists and power-play assists (21). He added six points (4g, 2a), including a team-high four goals, in six playoff games. Perron was twice named the USHL's Forward of the Week, and he closed the regular season with points in 22 of his final 25 contests (1/29-4/21: 9g, 30a), with 12 multi-point outings over that span. He also earned selection to the league's All-Rookie Team in 2021-22, posting 45 points (17g, 28a) in 60 games. Perron is committed to play college hockey at North Dakota next season, alongside fellow Hurricanes prospects Jackson Blake and Michael Emerson.



Nikita Quapp
Goaltender (70)
Drafted by CAR in the sixth round, 187th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Quapp played most of the 2022-23 season with Lausitzer Fuchse in Germany's second-highest professional league, posting a 6-6-0 record, 2.67 goals-against average and .917 save percentage in 12 games. He also made five playoff appearances, earning a 2-3 record, 2.81 goals-against average and .907 save percentage. Quapp appeared in one DEL games with Eisbaren Berlin, with a 3.11 goals-against average and .889 save percentage. He represented Germany at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship and was named one of the top three players on the team.



Massimo Rizzo

Center (46)

Drafted by CAR in the fifth round, 147th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Rizzo registered 46 points (17g, 29a) in 38 collegiate games during his sophomore season at Denver in 2022-23. He was named First-Team All-NCHC and Second-Team All-American, and he was selected as a finalist for NCHC Forward of the Year. Rizzo won the NCHC's scoring title, pacing all skaters with 20 assists and 31 points in 24 conference games, and he was twice named the NCHC Forward of the Week (1/9, 2/13). He posted a season-long, 11-game point streak from 11/26-1/14 (6g, 8a), with three of his 12 multi-point outings coming over that span.



Justin Robidas

Center (46)

Drafted by CAR in the fifth round, 147th overall, of the 2021 NHL Draft

Robidas opened his fourth QMJHL season with 42 points (14g, 28a) in 27 games as Val-d'Or's captain before being acquired by Quebec and winning the Gilles-Courteau Trophy and Memorial Cup. He closed the regular season with 36 points (11g, 25a) in 36 games for the Remparts and added 27 points (11g, 16a) in 18 QMJHL playoff games, ranking third in points, tied for fourth in assists and tied for second in plus/minus (+17) among all skaters during the postseason. Robidas posted a team-high five assists in four Memorial Cup games, becoming the first player since 2018 to tally two shorthanded assists in the tournament. He signed an entry-level contract with Carolina on 5/31, four days before the Memorial Cup final.



Felix Unger Sorum

Right Wing (36)

Drafted by CAR in the second round, 62nd overall, of the 2023 NHL Draft

Unger Sorum spent most of the 2022-23 season in Sweden's top junior league, recording 46 points (10g, 36a) in 42 games with Leksands IF's under-20 team and tying for the team lead in assists. He added nine points (4g, 5a) in seven playoff games, finishing tied for first on the team in goals and second in points during the postseason. Unger Sorum also skated in seven games with Leksands IF, making his SHL debut on 1/3. Born in Trondheim, Norway, he represents Sweden internationally and won a silver medal at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 World Championship, earning 10 points (2g, 8a) in seven games.



Jakub Vondras

Goaltender (50)

Drafted by CAR in the sixth round, 171st overall, of the 2022 NHL Draft

Vondras made 29 appearances with HC Plzen's under-20 team last season, posting an 18-10-0 record, 2.19 goals-against average, .929 save percentage and two shutouts. He also went 0-3 in the playoffs, with a 4.22 goals-against average and .827 save percentage. Vondras has played 40 games in Czechia's top junior league, earning a 24-13-0 record, 2.18 goals-against average, .926 save percentage and three shutouts. He was selected by Sudbury (OHL) with the 22nd overall pick in the 2023 CHL Import Draft.
