### COMEBACK 'CANES

Tonight's victory marks Carolina's 15th comeback win of 2024-25. Only Vegas and Washington (16) have more this season. It was also the Hurricanes' 18th win at Lenovo Center in 2024-25, matching Winnipeg, Toronto and Vegas for the most home wins in the NHL.

### YOUNG BLOOD

**Jackson Blake** scored his 10th goal of the season, becoming the fourth rookie to reach the 10-goal mark this season. Matvei Michkov and Macklin Celebrini (13) are the only rookies with more goals on the year. Blake tied **Seth Jarvis** (47 GP) for the sixth-fewest games by a rookie in Hurricanes team history (since relocation) to record 10 NHL goals. He trails **Andrei Svechnikov** (33 GP), Jeff Skinner (37 GP), Erik Cole (37 GP), **Sebastian Aho** (40 GP) and **Martin Necas** (43 GP).

### SETH APPEAL

**Seth Jarvis** scored two goals, giving him seven points (6g, 1a) in his last seven games. Since returning from injury on 11/25, Jarvis leads all Hurricanes skaters in goals and ranks second in points (11-11—22) behind **Sebastian Aho** (7-18—25). Tonight marks his seventh multi-point contest of the season, matching **Shayne Gostisbehere** for third among Hurricanes skaters, and his second multi-goal game of 2024-25, tied for second on the team behind **Jack Roslovic** (3). Tonight was Jarvis' 37th career multi-point game, ranking fifth in team history (since relocation) among Hurricanes skaters age 22 or younger. Only **Andrei Svechnikov** (68), **Sebastian Aho** (61), Eric Staal (55) and Jeff Skinner (44) tallied more at that age. His second goal tonight stood as the game-winner, his first GWG of the campaign.

### KLUTCH-ETKOV

**Pyotr Kochetkov** denied Keegan Kolesar's penalty shot attempt, and he is now 3-for-3 on penalty shot attempts in his career. The last time the Hurricanes faced a penalty shot was on 12/12/23 at OTT when Kochetkov denied Brady Tkachuk, and the last time they gave up a penalty shot goal was when Cam Atkinson scored on Alex Nedeljkovic on 2/8/21 at CBJ. Kochetkov is now tied for second in franchise history in penalty shot saves behind Cam Ward (8).

### FRIDAY NIGHT IN RALEIGHWOOD

The Hurricanes' win tonight marks their 92nd consecutive regular-season/playoff sellout at Lenovo Center (capacity 18,700), dating back to Feb. 24, 2023. The Hurricanes' last non-sellout at home came on 2/21/23, when a crowd of 18,142 watched the team post a 4-1 win vs. STL – a game that came two days after the team hosted 56,961 fans at Carter-Finley Stadium for the 2023 Stadium Series. During the 2023-24 season, Carolina sold out every single home game for the first time in franchise history, averaging 18,819 fans per game (includes standing-room attendance).

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

- Carolina went 0-for-4 on the power play tonight and is 31-for-143 (21.7%) on the man advantage in 2024-25. The Hurricanes went 2-for-3 on the penalty kill and are 116-for-137 (84.7%) on the kill this season.
- Vegas went 1-for-3 on the power play tonight and is 28-for-106 (26.4%) on the man advantage in 2024-25. The Golden Knights went 4-for-4 on the penalty kill and are 75-for-95 (78.9%) on the kill this season.
