-- Eric Robinson recorded an assist, marking his first point since Feb. 1 (10 games). Robinson (12g, 14a) is now one point shy of his career-high 27 points (10g, 17a) established in 2021-22.

-- Sebastian Aho tallied an assist, giving him points (1g, 1a) in back-to-back games and 10 points (7g, 3a) in his last 10 games.

-- Seth Jarvis scored, giving him goals in back-to-back games (2g) and 14 points (9g, 5a) in his last 16 games.

-- Jordan Martinook earned an assist, giving him three points (1g, 2a) in his last three games.

STANK SEASON

Logan Stankoven earned his first Hurricanes goal in his first Hurricanes game, giving him 30 points (10g, 20a) on the year. His point total would rank tied for seventh on the team with **Jack Roslovic** (19-11—30) and **Jordan Martinook** (11-19—30) and ranks fifth among rookie skaters. Stankoven became the third Hurricanes skater to score in their debut this season (also **Tyson Jost** & **Mark Jankowski**) and today marked the fourth game in franchise history in which multiple players each scored in their first-ever game with Hurricanes/Whalers. The others: Oct. 4, 2013 (Radek Dvorak: 1-0—1 & Nathan Gerbe: 1-0—1), Oct. 10, 2008 (Dan Lacouture: 1-0—1 & Joni Pitkanen: 1-0—1) and Feb. 26, 2003 (Mike Zigomanis: 1-0—1 & Tomas Kurka: 1-0—1). Stankoven also became the seventh player in franchise history to score the game-winning goal in their first-ever game with the club, joining Greg McKeeg (Jan. 4, 2019), Chris Terry (March 9, 2013), Dan Lacouture (Oct. 10, 2008), Brad Defauw (March 10, 2003), Curtis Leschyshyn (Nov. 9, 1996) and Rob Brown (Dec. 22, 1990).

MARK MY WORDS

Mark Jankowski scored his first goal and earned his first multi-goal game in a Hurricanes sweater in his first Hurricanes game, becoming only the sixth player in franchise history, third in team history (since relocation), to record multiple goals in their Hurricanes debut. Morgan Geekie (3/8/20: 2g, 1a), Brad DeFauw (3/10/03: 2g), James Patrick (11/3/93: 2g, 1a), Dave Semenko (12/17/86: 2g) and Gilles Lupien (2/22/81: 2g) are the only other players to record multi-goal games in their first game with the Hurricanes/Whalers. Today was Jankowski's first multi-goal performance since 2/13/20 (2g) and the sixth of his career. His goals give him 11 points (6g, 5a) on the season, four shy of matching his 15 points (7g, 8a) in 32 games from 2023-24. **Scott Morrow** tallied the assist on his first goal for his first NHL point/assist. Morrow leads all Wolves D-men and ranks second-T among Chicago skaters in points (13-26—39) through 51 AHL games this season.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Hurricanes' win tonight was their 25th on home ice this season, giving them sole possession of the most home wins in the NHL. Carolina's 25 home wins are the sixth-most in a single season in franchise history. Their most came in 2005-06, going 31-8-2 in Raleigh.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Logan Stankoven and **Mark Jankowski** made their Hurricanes debut today after being acquired from Dallas and Nashville respectively on Friday's Trade Deadline. Stankoven, acquired along with first-round picks in 2026 and 2028 and third-round selections in 2026 and 2027 in exchange for Mikko Rantanen, has totaled 10 goals and 20 assists (30 points) in 60 games with Dallas and Carolina this season. He registered eight points (3g, 5a) in 19 Stanley Cup playoff appearances last season, leading all rookie skaters in playoff points and helping Dallas reach the Western Conference Final. He made his NHL debut in Raleigh on Feb. 24, 2024. Jankowski, acquired by Carolina from Nashville for a fifth-round selection in the 2025 NHL Draft, has totaled 11 points (6g, 5a) in 42 games for the Predators and Hurricanes this

season. The Hamilton, Ont., native was originally selected by the Calgary Flames in the first round, 21st overall, at the 2012 NHL Draft. Jankowski (6'4", 212 lbs.) established career highs with Calgary in 2018-19, registering 14 goals and 18 assists (32 points).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, BURNZIE

Brent Burns turns 40 years old today, joining Ryan Suter as the only active player age 40 or older and becoming the 70th player in NHL history to play a game at age 40. Five other Hurricanes/Whalers have played for the club at 40 or older: Dave Keon (166 GP), Ron Francis (86 GP), Gordie Howe (80 GP), Bobby Hull (nine GP) and emergency backup goaltender David Ayres (one GP). Today marked the 10th time Burns has played an NHL game on his birthday, including his last two birthdays (2023 vs. PHI & 2024 vs. NJD). He has totaled seven assists in 10 games on March 9 in his career.

RAISING UP THE LENOVO CENTER

The Hurricanes' win tonight marked their 101st consecutive regular-season/playoff sellout at Lenovo Center (capacity 18,700), dating back to Feb. 24, 2023. The Hurricanes' last non-sellout at home came on 2/21/23, when a crowd of 18,142 watched the team post a 4-1 win vs. STL – a game that came two days after the team hosted 56,961 fans at Carter-Finley Stadium for the 2023 Stadium Series. During the 2023-24 season, Carolina sold out every single home game for the first time in franchise history, averaging 18,819 fans per game (includes standing-room attendance).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina went 1-for-6 on the power play today and is 36-for-191 (18.8%) on the man advantage in 2024-25. The Hurricanes went 3-for-3 on the penalty kill and are 159-for-189 (84.1%) on the kill this season.
- Winnipeg went 0-for-3 on the power play today and is 56-for-177 (31.6%) on the man advantage in 2024-25. The Jets went 5-for-6 on the penalty kill and are 133-for-167 (79.6%) on the kill this season.
