EHLERS ENDER

Nikolaj Ehlers recorded the game's lone goal in overtime tonight, marking his third game-winning goal of the season. Ehlers ranks second on the Hurricanes in game-winning goals this season, trailing Seth Jarvis (4 GWG). Ehlers now has 16 points (5g, 11a) in 25 games played this season.

BACK TO BUSSI

Brandon Bussi recorded 16 saves on 16 shots faced in his first career shutout tonight and improved to 5-0-0 in his last five appearances dating to Oct. 30. Bussi became the first Hurricanes/Whalers goalie to win seven of their first eight career NHL games (7-1-0) and the third goaltender with seven wins through his first eight appearances with the Hurricanes/Whalers following **Frederik Andersen** (8 in 2021-22) and **Martin Gerber** (7 in 2005-06). He started back-to-back games for the first time in his NHL career tonight, registering 27 saves on 28 shots faced in his last two appearances.

LOCKING UP LENOVO

The Hurricanes now have a home winning streak of five or more games against seven different franchises, one of which being the Flames (6-0-0 dating to 2019-20). The other teams are the Sabres (12-0-0), Canadiens (12-0-0), Penguins (8-0-0), Blue Jackets (6-0-0), Sharks (6-0-0) and Devils (5-0-0).

FILLING THE SEATS

The Carolina Hurricanes stretched their sellout streak to 129 consecutive regular-season and playoff games tonight. With the Lenovo Center undergoing renovations, the arena's capacity has changed to start this season and the seated capacity is now 18,299. That number will change again when the new View Bar seating opens on the 300 level during this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Carolina is 0-for-1 on the power play tonight and are 10-for-73 (13.7%) on the man advantage this season. The Hurricanes are 1-for-1 on the penalty kill and are 59-for-74 (79.7%) on the kill this season.
- Calgary is 0-for-1 on the power play tonight and are 12-for-90 (13.3%) on the power play this season. The Flames are 1-for-1 on the penalty kill and are 72-for-88 (81.8%) on the penalty kill this season.
